- c) Redesigning America's Community Colleges, Bailey, et al. Discussion of Introduction and Chapter 1 Hold over and revisit questions at next meeting
 - i. From your perspective, what are one or two "take-aways" from the Introduction and chapter 1?
 - i. "In this book, we argue that to improve their outcomes on a substantial scale in an environment very different from the past, colleges must undertake a more fundamental re-thinking of their organization and culture." (p. 12)
 - a. To what extent are outcomes dependent upon structure.
 - b. The authors present "guided pathways" as a solution to completion. The authors also suggest that peripheral reforms are doomed to mediocrity. What steps can be taken to create new structures?
