

Main Campus Landscaping and Signage

You may have noticed with the completion of the new Campus Safety offices that there is plenty of redwood bark, but no landscaping! Rest assured, it will not stay this way. In early November, The HLA Group Landscape Architects visited the main campus and met with members of the Landscape/Aesthetics Committee. In addition to gathering input from the committee, the HLA team took a walking tour of our campus during which they gathered many photos and notes in order to help them develop an overall landscape plan that will be beautiful and cohesive. In early December, a team from SMI Sign Systems visited our campus to discuss wayfinding and signage solutions to help students navigate our campus with greater ease. These two efforts will be combined with the intended result of an easily navigable campus housing beautiful spaces to walk through and enjoy.



Career and Technical Education Building (CTE)

This new facility comes in two parts to best address the needs of the CTE—Career and Technical Education—programs which focus on providing academic education and hands-on training to develop new skills for those desiring to enter the advanced manufacturing workforce or to improve upon pre-existing employment skills with further training. The 4,140 SF storage building will be shared by the disciplines taught in the CTE Quad (buildings 2400, 2500, 2600 and 2700). The 8,200 SF classroom building will house both a shop and computer labs in addition to supporting offices and storage.



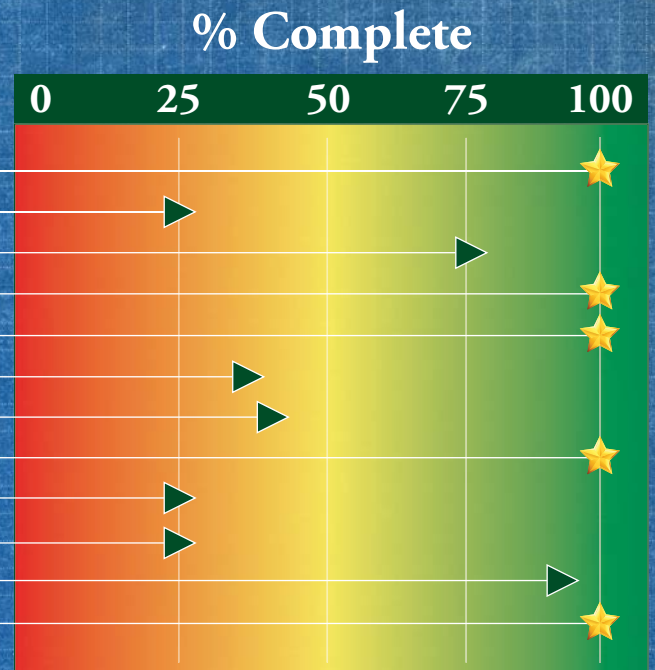
Campus Security Office Remodel

Classroom Buildings

Adjacent to the newly constructed training grounds, construction has begun on two new buildings. The first building will be a 6,500 SF building that will include an EMT classroom, a Fire Technology classroom, and an Administration of Justice classroom along with multiple offices that will house the director's, faculty and department offices for the associated programs. The second building will be 3,600 SF, and will include two classrooms as well as men's and women's locker rooms. These classrooms will be available for use by regional public safety entities. This project will provide a dedicated and concentrated space to better serve our safety training programs, and support a higher quality of workforce training to benefit our students and our community.



Veterans Support and Success Center

Shortly after the ground breaking ceremony for the Veterans Support and Success Center the earth moving began. In just a few short months the building is almost complete. The Veterans Support and Success Center will be a one stop shop for all of our Veteran student's needs. The building will include offices for financial aid specialists, academic counselors, technology stations, quiet rooms for studying, and more.

As the fourth building that is added to our Tehama Campus, the Student Services Building is a much needed addition. This building will house multiple faculty offices, counseling offices, a campus safety office, a Veteran's Services Center, a multi-use room, as well as administrative offices.
