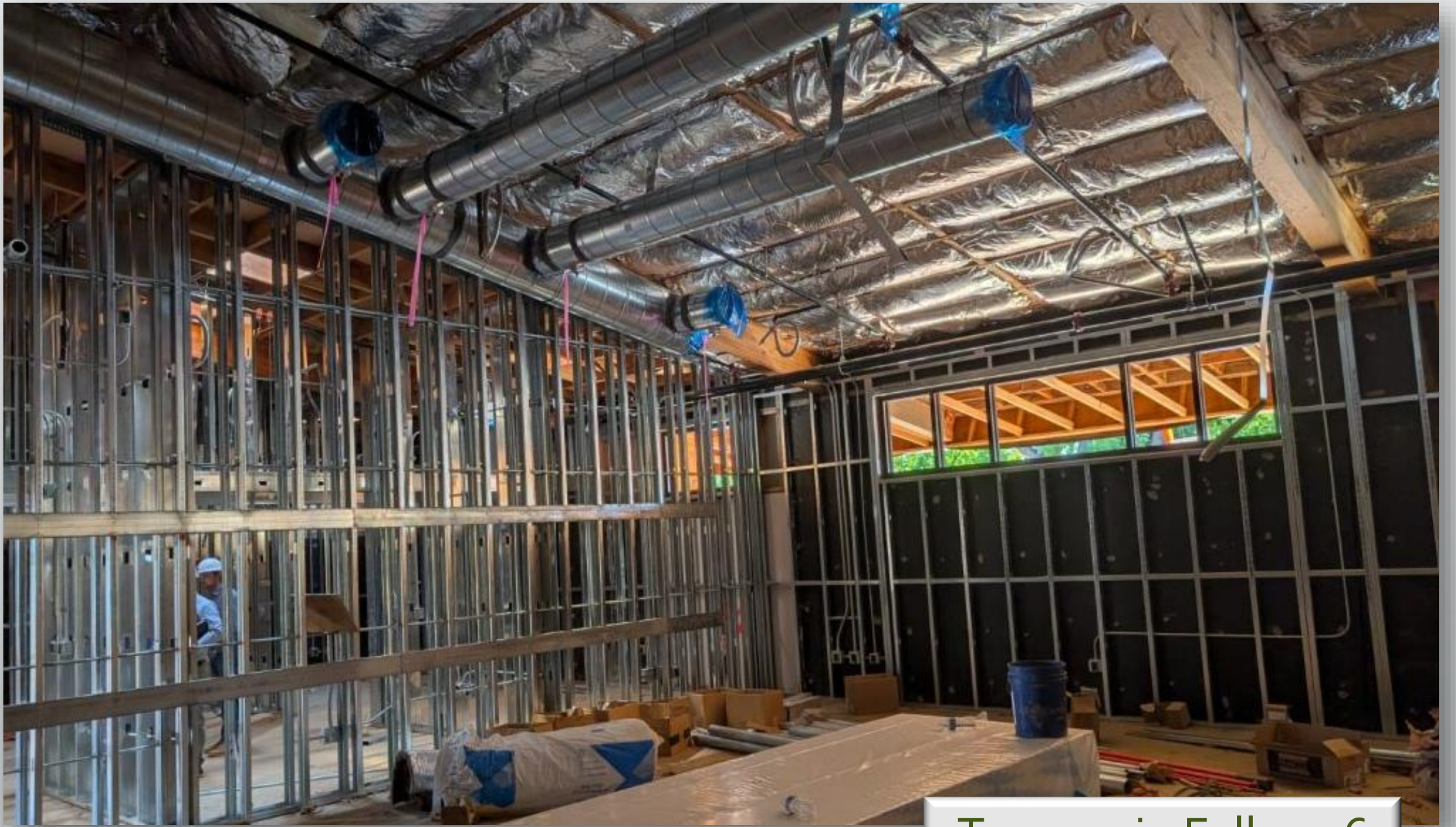

- Support hands-on learning and workforce training
- Expand access for rural and underrepresented communities
- Improve campus sustainability and operational efficiency
- Enhance the student and staff campus experience
- Align with long-term master plan priorities



Looking Forward

- Thanks to voters for supporting Bond Measure H (2016) and Prop 51 (Statewide educational facilities improvement bond)
- Campus transformation vital for our 60-year-old facilities
- Bond Measure H enables access to state matching funds
- 50% local match required for state facilities funding

\$15 Million in State Funding: Library & Tutoring Center Renovation

\$13.5 Million in State Funding: Life Sciences and 800 Building

Nearly \$40 Million in total outside funding

Future Considerations

- Modernization of labs, particularly the science buildings to support health occupation training
- Finish buildout of the Regional Public Safety Training Center
- Expand career and technical education capacity
- Support regional access to higher education (Corning extension)
- Focus on student-centered design

Although we have made great strides, there is still much to be done.



Proposed Facilities Improvement Measure November 2026

- Bond Size: Estimated \$75 to \$90 Million
- Acts as an extension to the Measure A General Obligation Bonds which are expiring
- Needed to continue campus revitalization started with Measure H
