PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

This certificate will prepare students for employment in entry-level automotive chassis repair jobs in the community. This certificate also serves as a pathway to ASE (Automotive Service Excellence) certification, the automotive certificate, and the associate degree. The content of this certificate provides students with an introduction to automotive electrical, brakes, and suspension repair.

This is a locally approved certificate. Upon satisfactory completion of the listed requirements and application for completion of the certificate to Admissions and Records, the student will receive a certificate of completion. This certificate is not approved through the California Community College Chancellor's Office; therefore, completion of the certificate will not be listed on the student's transcript.

PROGRAM LEARNING OUTCOMES:

1. Diagnose, service, and repair automotive brake and suspension systems using appropriate tools, equipment, and industry-standard procedures while adhering to all safety protocols.

This certificate is not approved through the California Community College Chancellor's Office; therefore, completion of the certificate will not be listed on the student's transcript.
