Shasta College

This sample pathway maps out requirements for most RN-to-BSN (Bachelor of Science Nursing) programs, and CSU General Education. It assumes that you have completed a RN/ADN degree and hold your Associates Degree in Nursing and a valid RN license.

Courses highlighted in pink do not have to be taken in order and most are offered online. If you are working full-time and have no other responsibilities then 2-3 classes per fall/spring term is recommended. If you are working full-time and have a lot of "life" going on, then 1-2 classes per fall/spring term might be more manageable. For GE classes, check with your counselor as you may have already taken a course that will fulfill the requirement.

*It is advisable to complete as many GE and pre-requisite classes as possible through Shasta College to minimize the cost (in money and time) of your RN-to-BSN degree at the university.

Most programs require that you already hold your RN license at the time you apply to the RN-to-BSN program; others allows you to apply in your last semester of your ADN program. Some programs require that you are currently employed at least part-time in a licensed RN position.

*Some programs require you to apply to the BSN program at the same time you apply to the university; others want you to apply to the BSN program first and then apply to the university if/after you get accepted into the BSN program.
