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Shasta College Extended Education

Shasta College District is located in the Far North region of the State, which is expressly identified as an area of high need in the California Community College's Vision for Success. Areas of high need are characterized as having low median household income and low educational attainment, which leads to low community college enrollment. Shasta College has made ongoing efforts to extend its valuable resources of education and job training by providing service to the most underserved areas of the district through the Extended Education Division.



Shasta College has 3 Extended Education Campuses across the district:

INTERMOUNTAIN CAMPUS located in Burney serves residents of: Burney, Fall River Mills, McArthur, Other Eastern Shasta County communities

TRINITY CAMPUS located in Weaverville serves residents of: Weaverville, Hayfork, Trinity Center, Other Trinity County communities

TEHAMA CAMPUS located in Red Bluff serves residents of: Red Bluff, Corning, Los Molinos, Other Tehama County communities

Each of the campuses embodies the "One-Stop-Shop" model. On-site staff assist students with application for admission, applying for financial aid, navigating the steps to matriculation, registration, ordering books, and assistance with applying for additional support programs. Each of the campuses has computers on-site that students can use, a student lounge area if students want to bring laptops and use the free WI-FI or just relax. Student Services staff and counselors work with local high schools at outreach events.

Where are we located and how can students access our services?

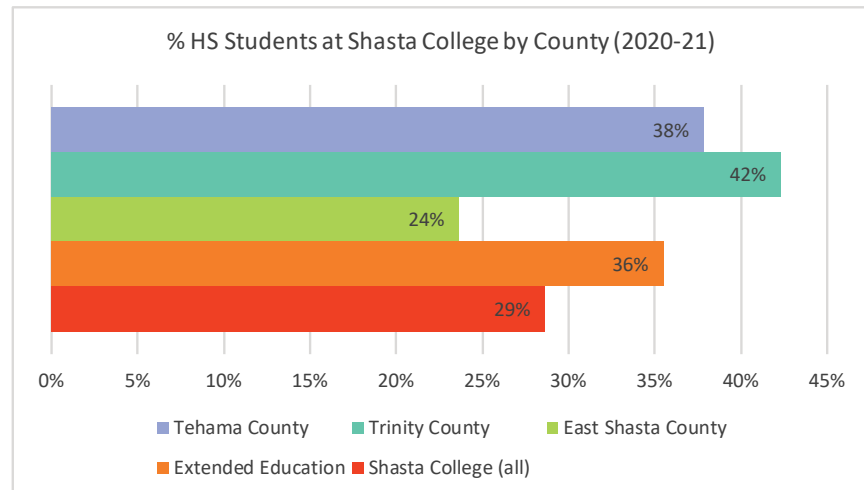

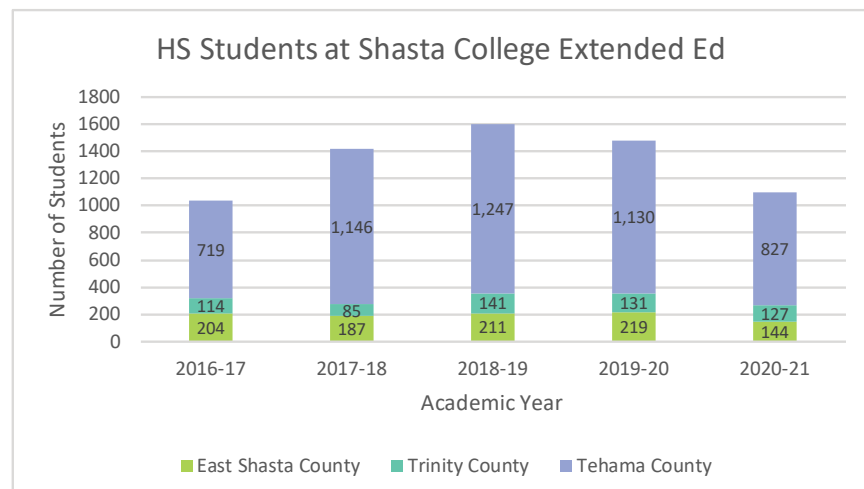
