

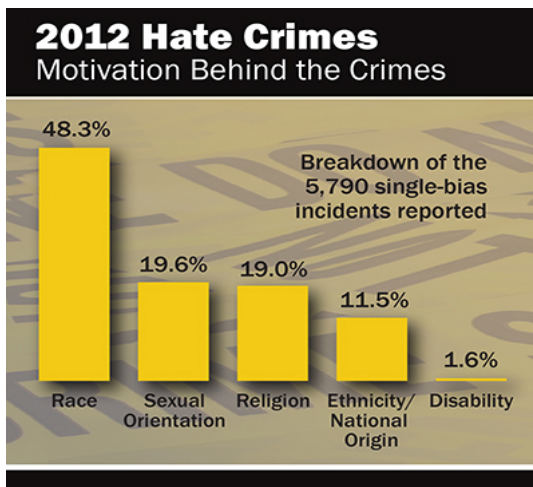
What Is A

Hate Crime?



Definition:

A hate crime is a criminal offense with an added element of bias. Congress has defined a hate crime as a “criminal offense against a person or property motivated by the offenders bias against race, religion, disability, ethnic origin or sexual orientation.” Traditional hate crime offenses include, but are not limited to:

How To File A Report...

- 1) Protect yourself. Do not respond to taunts.
- 2) Call 911 (emergency) or Campus Safety 530-242-7910 (non-emergency)
Say that you are reporting a hate crime.
- 3) Write down all the details of the crime as soon as possible (gender, height, weight, race, distinguishing characteristics, time, place, etc.).
- 4) File a police report.
- 5) Get medical help if needed. Find support!

Be a witness if someone else is a victim!
