Labeling Guidelines for:

HAZARDOUS WASTE

In order to meet Federal, State and County laws and regulations, any container that holds hazardous waste **must** be properly labeled as hazardous waste. To be consistent in content and format, Shasta College will use the standard Hazardous Waste labels which will contain the following information:

- The words, "HAZARDOUS WASTE"; [22 CCR §66262.34(f)].
- The waste accumulation start date.
- The physical state and composition of the waste (e.g., liquid pesticide).
- Declaration of any particular toxic or hazardous properties (e.g., flammability, strong oxidizer).
- Name and address of waste-generating facility.

Additionally, containers shall be labeled with the appropriate DOT label identifying the waste hazard class (see www.shastacollege.edu/hazmat/DOTLabels).

Used Oil

In addition to the above requirements, add the words "USED OIL" to all containers, tanks and fill pipes used to transfer oil into an underground tank.







Drained Used Oil and Fuel Filters

Containers of used oil and/or diesel filters shall be labeled with the following:

- The words "DRAINED USED OIL FILTERS."
- The initial date of accumulation.
